Announcement of the conference Volume of the 4th International G.R.E.A.T. Conference "Informal Learning in Vocational Education and Training"

The conference volume contains selected papers from the 4th International G.R.E.A.T. Conference, which took place at the University of Cologne in September 2022. This book was initiated to fill a gap in the understanding of informal learning in the context of vocational education and training (VET). It does so by examining a wide range of aspects and different objectives, levels and locations of informal learning. The authors, selected from different parts

of Europe as well as Japan, Australia, India and Bangladesh, contribute to the topic from different country perspectives. As such, this volume makes a unique contribution to the study of informal learning in VET.

Visit of Prof. Dr Stephen Billett from Griffith University, Australia

On October 23, the German Research Center for Comparative Vocational Education and Training (G.R.E.A.T.) welcomed Prof. Dr Stephen Billett as a guest researcher at the University of Cologne. He shared his expertise on the Australian VET system in a presentation at our institute, focusing on three key questions: "Why are VET systems often so different in different countries?", "What causes them to change?" and "What makes a mature VET system?"

Dr Stephen Billett is Professor of Adult and Vocational Education in the School of Education and Professional Studies at Griffith University, Brisbane, Australia, and a National Teaching Fellow and Australian Research Council Future Fellow.

Successful completion of the RecoVET project

The RecoVET project was successfully completed at the end of August 2024. As a result of the project, a concept for external evaluation and recognition of specific quality in the integration of refugees was developed and transferred into three products: an online training course for quality auditors, a complementary handbook and a practice-oriented toolbox for the implementation of evaluation and recognition of specific quality indicators. In different <u>multiplier events</u> of the RecoVET project in Germany, Austria, Spain and Italy, the project

partners presented the project results (online training tool, handbook and toolbox) to the target group and discussed in detail how the results can be used.
